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| 32 | Pinotage, Klippenkop, Stellenbosch, South Africa
South Africa's own grape is earthy, flavoursome and thoroughly unique! | 2010 | £17.95 |

The Alentejano region of Portugal is making a serious name for itself as a wine producing region. We have championed this wine from the start for its lush red berry fruits with complex aromas and subtle spice - 'sunshine in a glass'. | 34 | Palazzo della Torre, Allegrini, Italy
